Charles H.F. Davis III is Assistant Professor of Higher Education and Director of the Campus Abolition Research Lab at the University of Michigan where he teaches undergraduate and graduate courses, advises graduate students, and supervises graduate research. Dr. Davis has more than a decade of professional experience and expertise on issues of racial justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion in higher education and the private sector. Dr. Davis has been nationally-recognized by the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, as a 2020 Emerging Scholar by Diverse Issues in Higher Education, a 2021 National Academy of Education/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship, and 2024 Inductee to the Martin Luther King, Jr. College of Ministers and Laity's Collegium of Scholars at Morehouse College. Dr. Davis is engaged in an active ethnographic research program concerned with understanding the racialized consequences of higher education on society, to include the ways campus and community organizers collaboratively resist university expansion, urban renewal, and the institution of policing. Dr. Davis is co-editor of Student Activism, Politics, and Campus Climates in Higher Education (Routledge) and author of the forthcoming Campus Abolition and Police-Free Futures (Johns Hopkins University Press). Dr. Davis has produced nearly three dozen scholarly publications, which have been cited in amicus curiae brief to the Supreme Court of the United States and included as expert testimony before the California State Assembly. Dr. Davis has also served in various capacities to the university, numerous professional associations, and academic journals. Additionally, Dr. Davis' work has been featured by Academe, The Boston Globe, Change Magazine, Chronicle of Higher Education, Diverse Issues in Higher Education, EdSurge, EdWeek, Inside Higher Ed, Los Angeles Times, and other international, national, and local media outlets.
